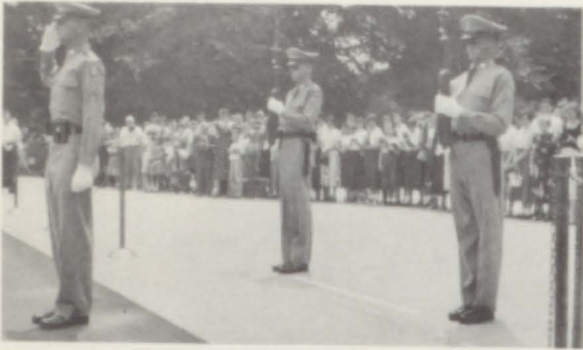
# THE SENIOR TRIP

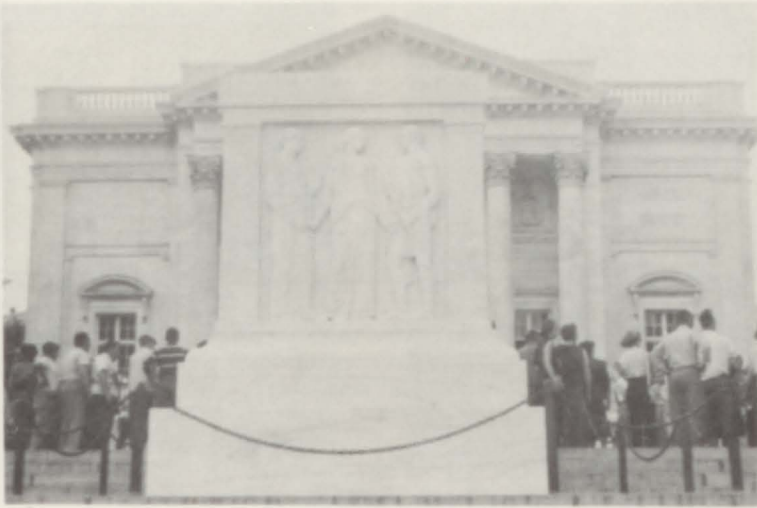

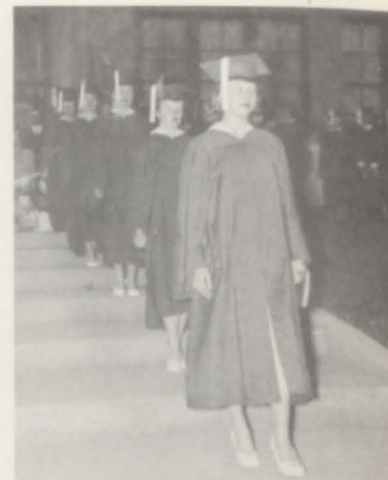
