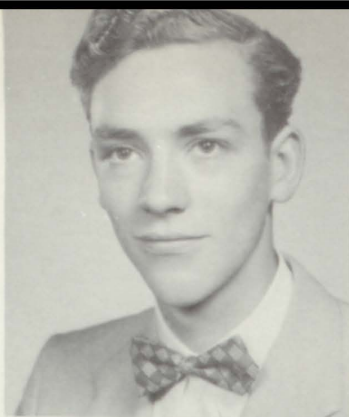
History

As Juniors we sold magazines and put on the annual Jr. Sr. Prom and Banquet. We also had our Junior Play.

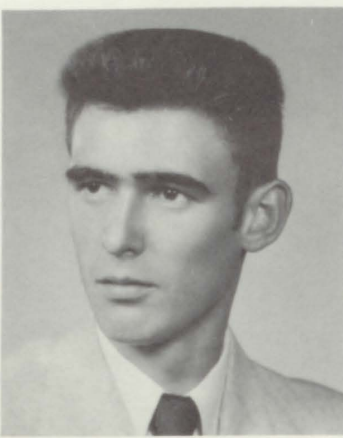
At last we are seniors waiting impatiently for our Commencement to come.
